WHAT'S INSIDE?

WHAT'S INSIDE? is our presentation designed for pupils who are in the final stage of their primary education.

This interactive programme aims to equip pupils in P7 to deal with the changes that so often cause concern and anxiety at their age. We remind pupils that they are all unique by looking at the process of conception, the amazing construction of our bodies and the continuing process of growing up. The gender-specific puberty talk is often the most reassuring part of the day for pupils who are worried about changes in their bodies. Target setting, friendship and assertive behaviour skills are also addressed in the presentation.



TITLE: WHAT'S INSIDE? PRIMARY: 7 TIME: 3HRS

All of our programmes are media-rich, interactive and packed full of activities to maximise the level of engagement and fun for pupils as they develop the skills and capabilities for managing change.

Topics covered in the presentation:

- Conception and pregnancy
- The rollercoaster of growing up
- Managing an online life
- Coping with change
- Peer pressure

THINKING SKILLS & CAPABILITIES AT THE END OF STAGE 2



SELF-MANAGEMENT

- Evaluate what they have learned and compare their approaches with others
- Make links between their learning in different contexts
- Become more self-directed by working on their own or with a group
- Learn ways to manage their own time
- Seek help from a variety of sources
- Work towards personal targets identified by themselves or jointly with their teachers
- Be more confident in their knowledge of personal strengths and weaknesses

MANAGING INFORMATION

- Be able to ask deeper and wider questions to clarify a task and to plan and set goals
- Begin to challenge conventions and assumptions
- Be able to classify, compare and evaluate information and to select the most appropriate methods for a task
- Develop methods for collating and recording information and monitoring progress
- Have a sense of audience and purpose

WORKING WITH OTHERS

- Become more independent in their social and interpersonal skills
- Show that they can work in different roles in a group and take responsibility for appropriate tasks
- Be willing to help others with their learning
- Understand and learn to respond to feedback
- Work with their peers to reach agreements and begin to manage disagreements

BEING CREATIVE

- Pose questions that do not have straightforward answers and seek out problems to solve and challenge the routine method
- Use all the senses to stimulate and contribute to ideas
- Experiment with different modes of thinking
- See the opportunities in mistakes and failures
- Learn from and build on their own and others ideas and experiences
- Value other peoples ideas
- Experiment with objects and ideas in a playful way
- Make ideas real by experimenting with different ideas, actions and outcomes
- Begin to develop their own value judgements about the merits of their work

THINKING, PROBLEM SOLVING & DECISION MAKING

- Show the ability to use memory strategies to deepen understanding
- Identify and order patterns and relationships through a range of strategies such as grouping, classifying and reclassifying and comparing and contrasting
- Make and test predictions, examine evidence and make links between possible cause and effects
- Discriminate between fact and opinion and question the reliability of evidence
- Understand more than one point of view
- Examine options and weigh up pros and cons
- Try alternative problem solving solutions and approaches
- Use different types of questions systematically and with purpose

BIRDS & THE BEES



How can we ensure that we are equipping our young people with the values, skills and information necessary to make healthy choices in the area of relationships and sex? In the current context of immense media and peer pressure, this programme seeks to empower parents, carers and those working with young people to tackle the sensitive issues, to explore practical methods of communication and to understand healthy boundaries for relationships.

This seminar is a great opportunity to gather parents and carers together to explore some of the topics and ideas that can sometimes leave parents feeling embarrassed, ill-equipped and anxious. Research continues to suggest that parents are the greatest influence on young people so programmes like this are very important.

FACE TO FACEBOOK



Increasing numbers of children are accessing the internet and enjoying its benefits. However, the risks of online activity for children are also on the increase. The rapid change in how we communicate and educate can often leave parents and carers feeling out of touch or ill-equipped to deal with important issues.

In response to this, Love for Life has developed Face to Facebook – a programme to help adults understand the online world and identify the potential risks for their young people. Throughout this interactive workshop, participants will identify keys to help them unlock a fresh understanding of technology and identify strategies to help them and their young people as they manage their online profiles.
